Location for filming - outside or inside your house, garden, which room, check lighting, quiet space

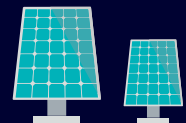


Props - if you use any props such as posters and/or drawings, costumes/dress-ups, or objects to help explain your idea, make sure you have these ready before presenting
