PROGRESS

CONSTRUCTION ACHIEVEMENTS JANUARY 2024

- 1,420 metres excavated in tailrace tunnel
- Two significant underground works milestones achieved, with the breakthrough of both the transformer hall and machine hall cavern crowns
- Drill and blast excavation of 11 cross passages and construction tunnels

TUNNELLING

TBM LADY EILEEN HUDSON

- Completed 2.85km main access tunnel in 2022
- Currently excavating 6km tailrace tunnel
- Has completed 26m in a single day during this drive
- Tunnel boring machine is 137m long, 11m diameter

TBM KIRSTEN

- Completed tunnelling 2.93km emergency, cable and ventilation tunnel (ECVT)
- Being modified for tunnelling 1.45km inclined pressure shaft (IPS) and then 2km of headrace tunnel
- 211m long and setting a global standard in TBM technology
- Excavating IPS at a 47% incline over 1.45km with an 11m diameter TBM is without precedent

TBM FLORENCE

- About 280 metres into 15km excavation of the headrace tunnel at Tantangara
- TBM restarted in December 2023 after pausing due to soft ground and the formation of a surface depression
- 143 metre long TBM has moved into competent rock and is progressing well
