This PIRMP is applicable to Environmental Protection Licences (EPLs) 10515, 10379 & 13161.

Actions taken by Snowy Hydro Limited's Emergency Response Teams (ERTs) to combat the emergency will be guided by the Regional Emergency Response Handbooks as specific to the incident or emergency context.
